**VILLAGE QUILT GUILD MINUTES OCTOBER 9, 2008**

President Kitty Stonecipher called the meeting to order at 9:30 AM.

Present were 94 members and 4 guest.

The minutes from the September meeting were approved and will be filed.

The treasurer's report from the September meeting has wrong date entered. The report will be filed for audit.

The Designing Divas group presented the program. The articles on display and intuitive information were very much appreciated.

**New Business:**

In the By-Laws it states the \$1.00 will be collected from each member for room rent. This is no longer necessary and will be excluded in new printing of the By-Laws.

The committee chairs are requested to submit budget request for 2009 by October 25<sup>th</sup>. The request may be done by e-mail, letter, or telephone.

The Board had a request for additional quilt racks for display purposes. Nola Abraham will explore the options concerning cost and quality of the additional quilt racks. Nola will report her findings at the November guild meeting. The general consensus of the guild members was to have a good quality product as opposed to lesser cost.

**Tip of the Day:** The first sewing machine for consumer use was in 1853 by a ditch digger named Isaac Singer. The first thimble was a Roman bronze piece at Pompeii in the 1<sup>st</sup> century AD. England had a thimble in 1695 by a Dutch metal worker named Lafting made of brass, iron, or steel. Other materials for thimbles are leather, rubber, wood, glass, or china. Natural materials might be used are Connemara marble, bog oak, mother of pearl, whale bone, horn, or ivory.

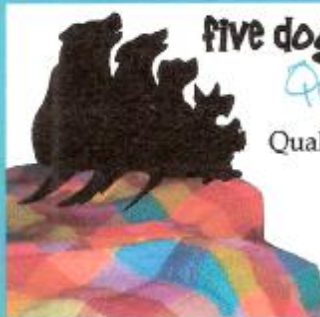
